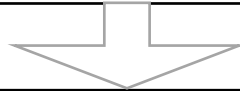




OPFCC FLYTIPPING GRANT – APPLICATION PROCESS

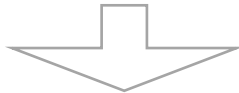
Fly tipping occurs. Landowner contacts Local Authority (LA) to report it. An application pack can then be emailed from the LA website for completion



The application is submitted along with supporting evidence (see checklist). The LA will only accept applications which have included ALL the required supporting evidence. If deemed eligible for the grant, the LA will submit the application to the OPFCC.



Funding application is reviewed by the OPFCC, and where needed referred to a Crime Prevention Officer (CPO) provide advice and information about target hardening methods that could be suitable. A second application may then follow for target hardening measures to be employed following advice from the CPO.



Max 2 weeks



If the bid is successful, the OPFCC will inform the LA of their decision and the amount to be awarded. The LA will inform the landowner who will arrange for the waste to be cleared, unless the LA are doing this as part of their in house waste contract. The OPFCC will reimburse the land owner on presentation of the invoice for clearance to the local authority, or if the clearance has been undertaken by the LA, initial payments will be made by the LA, and the LA invoice the OPFCC on a quarterly basis.

Unsuccessful applicants will be informed via the Local Authority representatives, with details of why they haven't been successful

Target hardening measures are installed and the landowner sends invoice to the local authority for reimbursement via the OPFCC. Where the site allows the LA officer will also assess the site's suitability for cameras and or signage.
